

GERI (EVANS) STREET



Imagine representing Saskatchewan at National Championships throughout six decades! That's Geri Street's amazing achievement as she earned spots on a multitude of provincial teams and competed in every province except Newfoundland.

Geraldine Evans began her golf career at age sixteen when she won the inaugural provincial Junior Championship in 1951. Three more junior titles followed in the next few years and a junior team spot in 1953. She won the Ladies' Amateur Provincial title five times between 1954 and 1969 and was runner-up once. She was on the Saskatchewan Women's Amateur Team eighteen times. Moving to Senior Provincials she won the Championship twice and was runner-up six times between 1988 and 2006. Geri has been on the

Saskatchewan Senior Women's team nineteen times since 1986. The excitement of becoming a Canadian Champion occurred as a member of the Saskatchewan Senior Team in 1990. Her best personal finish was third in 1993.

Geri has competed in numerous Saskatoon City Championships, and had her name engraved on the trophy in every decade from the 1950s to the 1990s. While she was a member of the Saskatoon Golf and Country Club she had a lock on the Club Championship with twenty-seven wins, several more as Senior Champion, then added to the total as Moon Lake Club Champion.

Geri grew up in Saskatoon and has been interested in many other sports over the years. She has been a role model for women golfers in Saskatchewan. Geri Street was inducted into the 1988 Saskatchewan and Saskatoon Sports Halls of Fame for her golf achievements.
