

NANCY (MOEN) HARVEY



Saskatchewan golf fans enthusiastically followed Nancy Harvey's nineteen-year career with the Ladies Professional Golf Association. They often scanned tournament results to see how the gal from Swift Current was doing, from her rookie year in 1989 to her retirement in 2007.

Nancy Moen began her golfing career at Elmwood Golf and Country Club as a youngster. She soon qualified for the Saskatchewan Junior Team and represented the province in 1977, 1978 and 1980. She ended her junior career rated tenth in the country. She won the Saskatchewan Amateur Championship in 1980 and was a member of the provincial Amateur Team the following three years.

While Nancy attended Arizona State University she played on their golf team in NCAA events. The team placed second in 1984 and third in the 1985 Championship. After marriage to Glen Harvey in 1985 she moved to the United States permanently to begin her professional golf career. She placed second in the LPGA Teaching and Club Professional Championship in 1987. She qualified for non-exempt status on the LPGA tour in 1989, then continued competing on the tour in the following years. The best year Nancy had was in 1997 when she finished second at the Welch's Championship, lost a sudden-death playoff at the Sara Lee Classic, and had a hole-in-one at another tournament.

Nancy Harvey continues to give back to her sport. Along with Marc Habsheid, she formed a foundation to raise money to support junior girls' golf and minor sports in Swift Current.
